Scholarship Program: National School Plant Management Association

The National School Plant Management Association (NSPMA) seeks to assist students as they continue their education by offering scholarships to students in search of an Associate or Bachelor's

degree.

Any graduating high school senior, college freshman, sophomore, or junior is eligible to apply for a scholarship. Individual scholarships may range from \$500 to \$1,500 depending on candidate interest and evaluation results, and upon recommendation from the Scholarship Committee.

Following the award of a scholarship, the scholarship payment is made directly to the college or university and credited to the recipient's account.

Individuals interested in being considered must complete all application materials and submit the required documents to be received at the postal address by March 1, 2011.
